HEARTWORM/FRONTLINE

The season for Heartworm and Frontline is over. It is up to you, if you would like to continue your monthly medications for your Greyhound. We recommend May 1st through the second killing frost, usually this is Dec. 1st.

If you do not continue the monthly pills for Heartworm year round, you must have another test taken on your hound in the Spring before giving a Heartworm pill. If you give a pill and your dog is positive for Heartworm, your dog could die.

WINTER TIPS

Have a winter coat for your Greyhound if you must walk them. After every time you come in from a walk, make sure you wash your dogs feet thoroughly. Salt can make their feet crack or worse.

If you need to use salt on your property, you may want to buy the brand "Safe Paws" at your local Petco or Petsmart store. "Safe Paws" is safe for kids, pets and plants.

Ice can also do a lot of damage to our fur kids legs and feet, especially if the snow cover becomes ice coated. Have plenty of Neosporin, peroxide and Vet Wrap on hand.

HOLIDAYS

Aren't Holidays fun! All the candies, cakes, pies, food, drinks, presents and people. You must be careful of poinsettia plants since these plants are quite poisonous.

Chocolate can also harm your dogs, especially Bakers Chocolate. If your Greyhound were to eat Chocolate, you must make a mixture of 50% peroxide 50% water. You go outside with a turkey baster. Filling the baster with the mixture, point the dogs head straight up, insert the baster to the back of the dogs throat, squeeze mixture quickly into the dogs mouth. Hold the dogs mouth closed so the dog will have to swallow. Then stand back. The dog will barf up everything it has eaten.

With people coming in and out of the house during the holidays you may want to crate your dog, or put it in a room that may be safer than your dog roaming the house. It probably won't be your family letting the dogs out. It will be friends. You don't want to loose your dog or a friendship.
