HOLIDAYS ARE COMING!!!

The Holiday season is the great time of year when families and friends get together to share meals and each other's company. Please be very careful with your hounds when it comes to doors, food, plants and decorations.

Make sure that your hound is NOT in danger of escaping. Please let your guests know that you need them to be extremely careful when going in and out the door. Try putting up baby gates to block the door where people are coming in and out. No one wants to have a tragedy. The unusual commotion of the holiday season can be stressful, put your hound in a quiet and comfortable room if they appear stressed.

Certain plants such as Mistletoe berries, and the leaves, stem and flowers of the Poinsettia can be dangerous to pets. Foods and drinks such as alcoholic beverages, seeds and pits from many fruits, chocolate, macadamia nuts, walnuts, coffee, tea, salt, onions, and other foods can be harmful to pets. Items such as chicken bones can easily shatter and choke your pet. Decorations such as tinsel, glass ornaments and garlands are dangerous choking hazards. Electric decorations such as stringed lights can give your pets a shock should they chew on the wires. Keep decorations out of their reach.

If you must thaw your food in the sink, make sure your hound can't get to it. Many a Thanksgiving Turkey has been eaten, precooked, because of hounds being able to get to it. The Greyhounds have a one track food mind. Protect them. Holidays are no fun spending it in the Emergency Clinic.

Chocolate can harm your dogs, especially Bakers Chocolate. If your Greyhound were to eat chocolate, you must make a mixture of 50% peroxide 50% water. You go outside with a turkey baster. Filling the baster with the mixture, point the dogs head straight up, insert the baster to the back of the dogs throat, squeeze mixture quickly into the dogs mouth. Hold the dogs mouth closed so the dog will have to swallow. Then stand back. The dog will barf up everything it has eaten. It may continue for some time. Hopefully, you will never have to do this to your dog. Please be careful!

HEARTWORM/FRONTLINE

The season for Heartworm and Frontline is almost over. It is up to you, whether you would like to continue your monthly medications for your Greyhound through the winter months. We recommend May 1st through the second killing frost, usually this is Dec. 1st.

If you <u>do not</u> continue the monthly pills for Heartworm year round, you <u>must</u> have another heartworm test taken on your hound in the Spring, <u>before</u> giving a Heartworm pill. If you give a pill and your dog is positive for Heartworm, your dog could die.

Dr. James Wahl

We can never say enough about our Dr. Wahl and his staff at the Avenue Animal Hospital in Tinley Park. If you haven't visited Dr. Wahl, you are really missing out on knowing a very special man. He is REGAP's best friend. Without him, we couldn't exist.

WRIGLEY'S STORY

When the tiny red male puppy was just one hour old, his Mommy stepped on his right front paw. The injury was left to heal on its own. It did heal but was misshapen and smaller than the left paw due to damage to the growth plate. As little Wrigley grew and began to run and jump and play there was further damage to the soft tissue on his paw because of the irregular way it came in contact with the ground. The pads on his toes were soon worn down and infected. Wrigley came to REGAP at three and a half months old with a wrapped foot and on oral antibiotics.

Our wonderful Dr. Wahl began treating Wrigley immediately. It was discovered that one pad was down to exposed bone and would probably never heal. Cultures taken of the infection revealed that the there were at least three types of bacteria in the paw one of which was a form of e-coli that tested resistant to the oral antibiotics.

Sadly little Wrigley underwent surgery on Thursday October 28th and has lost three toes to the infection. He is currently recovering from his ordeal and receiving daily injections of antibiotics that will hopeful be effective in stopping the infection.

Please keep him in your thoughts & prayers as he is not out of the woods yet. Wrigley is a very sweet boy whose spirit remains bright in spite of the fact that he has lived with pain his whole life.

As you have read with the two stories on this page, we recently rescued two young greyhounds that need medical attention. There are many items needed to care for our greyhounds waiting for adoption, some of the items needed are: dog food (Nutro Lamb & Rice), blankets, sheets & towels (new or old), Kuranda dog beds (http:// www.kuranda.com/shop/donate.asp), bleach/ detergent, paper towels, cotton balls, Q-tips, stamps. Don't throw away your old muzzles, coats or leashes, send them to Mona, we can use them. All donations are tax deductible. Check if your employer matches your donation, this way you can help twice as much. We are grateful for all contributions.

WOLFGANG'S STORY

When little Wolfgang was less than a week old his Momma stepped on his front right leg, breaking it in several places. As with Wrigley, it was left to heal on its own. The leg healed incorrectly and the growth plate was damaged in the large bone of his leg. Wolfgang came to REGAP when he was almost 4 months old full of spunk and love. He is a happy go lucky little brindle boy who doesn't know that anything is wrong with him and thinks the pain is part of life.

We brought Wolfgang to Dr. Dullard, who is a wonderful vet in Mendota and specializes in orthopedic surgery, a week after we received him. We spent 2 1/2 hours having several x-rays and consulting with Dr. Dullard on the damage to his leg. Wolfie was so tuckered out after a while that we had to wake him up to go back to the x-ray room. Wolfie will need several surgeries. The first surgery would be to break the large bone in his leg that has stopped growing because of the growth plate damage and to attach a metal halo apparatus around his leg. This halo will be on his leg for many months while he continues to grow and we will have to turn a lever on the halo on a regular basis to keep up with his growth. Once he is grown he will have another surgery to take a piece of bone from his hip to place in the space where his large bone stopped growing.

If he does not have surgery the one smaller bone in his leg will continue to grow causing a continued bowing effect which will eventually make the leg useless, or worse yet, snap because of the pressure. Dr. Dullard is attempting to get the halo donated to our not-for-profit group and we don't have an estimated cost yet on any of the surgeries.

Wolfie will need all the love and attention he can get in the many months ahead, which we are more than willing to do. We will keep everyone updated and will post pictures of his progress. Please keep Wolfie and Wrigley in your thoughts and prayers.

TEN COMMANDMENTS FOR A RESPONSIBLE PET OWNER

- 1. My life is likely to last 10 to 15 years. Any separation from you will be very painful.
- 2. Give me time to understand what you want of me.
- Place your trust in me—it is crucial for my wellbeing.
- 4. Don't be angry with me for long, and don't lock me up as punishment. You have your work, your friends, your entertainment. *I have only you!*
- 5. Talk to me. Even if I don't understand your words, I understand your voice when it's speaking to me.
- 6. Be aware that however you treat me, I'll never forget it.
- 7. Before you hit me, remember that I have teeth that could easily crush the bones in your hand, but I choose not to bite you.
- 8. Before you scold me for being lazy or uncooperative, ask yourself if something might be bothering me. Perhaps I'm not getting the right food, I've been out in the sun too long, or my heart may be getting old and weak.
- 9. Take care of me when I get old. You, too, will grow old.
- 10. Go with me on difficult journeys. Never say, "I can't bear to watch it" or, "Let it happen in my absence." Everything is easier for me if you are there. Remember, I love you.

AVID CHIPS & DOG TAGS

Many of the old Avid chip tags had stickers with the microchip number on them. As they have gotten old they are not readable. You may want to contact Avid (PETrac) about the brass tag they have available. You can also make your own with the Avid phone number and chip number on it. Just make sure the tag has the following information:

Please ALWAYS have a collar on your hound with their dog tags securely on it. If you can't stand the sound of jingle jangle tags, put a rubber band around them or tape them together. There is also a product that you can find on the internet called a "pocket" that your tags go into on the collar. Too many dogs have lost their homes because they faced the world naked.

A dog without ID cannot find its way home!!!

WINTER SAFETY

When the weather gets cold and nasty please be sure to be careful very with your hounds. They have very thin fur and skin with minimal fat, so they have no defenses from the cold. If you have a fenced in yard, please make sure that your hound simply goes out to do their business and then immediately returns to the warmth of your home. Beware of icy patches on your deck or patio. If you need to use salt on your property, you may want to buy the brand "Safe Paws" at your local Petco or Petsmart store. "Safe Paws" is safe for kids, pets and plants.

If you must walk your hound, please put on their coat and make the walk as short as possible. The salt and other chemicals used to melt snow and ice can irritate the pads of your hounds feet. After every time you come in from a walk wash and wipe the feet with a damp towel before your pet licks them and irritates his/her mouth. Salt can make their feet crack or worse.

Ice can also do a lot of damage to our fur kids legs and feet, especially if the snow cover becomes ice coated. Have plenty of Neosporin, peroxide and Vet Wrap on hand.

Antifreeze is a deadly poison, wipe up spills and store out of reach.
