4th ANNUAL REGAP PICNIC

Our annual Picnic will be Saturday, September 24th from 10:00 am to Dusk at Wil-Moore Farm & Kennel. We will be having the Blessing of the Hounds at 11:00 a.m., followed by our annual Greyhound Memorial. The greyhound memorial is in remembrance of all of the greyhounds that have passed since last September. We write each of their names on a balloon and release the balloons. The greyhound memorial is also for all of the greyhounds throughout the world who never get the chance to have a loving home.

Bring your family and friends for a fun filled day of food, contests, shopping, auction fundraising, raffles, etc. Send \$15 per person (this includes: 1 hamburger, 1 hot dog, 3 side dishes, and pop) to Mona before September 10th or pay \$20 per person the day of the picnic when you arrive. The lunch begins at noon, followed by auctions and raffles starting at 1:30 p.m. We had so many wonderful items donated last year for the auction, so don't miss it! After the auctions and raffles, we will start the Pet Contest. Be sure to send in your form with your check. You will be receiving the form in the mail with the invitation but you can also find it on our website.

We have screened in tents but you should be prepared for any type of weather, hot or cold. We will have dog pools, hoses and water dishes to cool down your hounds. Bring your cool coat, if you don't have one we will have some for sale. Bring chairs, blankets, canopy (if you have one), sunscreen, bug spray, muzzles (they can't run in the field without it), x-pen. Please Frontline your dogs!! If you plan on bringing any other breed of dog, please keep them leashed at all times, especially smaller dogs. We have several not small animal greyhounds and we don't want a tragedy. This day is for the greyhounds!

TAB Photo will be taking pet portraits. Tad has been helping REGAP raise money for years by taking his wonderful photos for special events. You may want to get your holiday photos done early. He truly takes the best photos of the hounds.

We will have even more vendors this year, along with plenty of REGAP items for sale. It's a greyt way to raise money for the greyhounds.

If you have anything you would like to donate or sell (it doesn't have to be a greyhound item), please contact Mona at 815-538-DOGS. Donations to REGAP are tax deductible. We appreciate anything! We are collecting old cell phones and printer cartridges (ink/laser). Collect them from home, from your community, from work and then bring them to the picnic. BLOOMINGDALES - THE SHOPPING BENEFIT

REGAP of Illinois is selling \$10 tickets (see the enclosed order form in this newsletter) and REGAP gets the full \$10. Each ticket entitles the bearer to a 15 - 20% savings certificate, with few exclusions, valid only during The Shopping Benefit event on August 31, 2005. This is a discount on top of whatever is already on sale. When you walk in to the store you hand your ticket to the volunteer at the door, they tear off the bottom portion and return the top portion to you. You will use the top portion of the ticket when you purchase your items. With each bottom portion collected at the door with REGAP's stamp on it, REGAP gets another \$5. You can purchase as many tickets as you want but you can only walk through the door with one ticket. So if you buy a few tickets, just hand them out to family and friends and have them walk through the door with a ticket. It's also a greyt gift idea! You can help even if you aren't planning on buying anything, because the more tickets that walk through the door on that day, the more REGAP gets.

You can shop a week in advance of the sale, you get the sale prices plus the discount, you just can't take your purchases home with you until the day of the sale (or any day after). Also, if you open a Bloomingdale's credit card during this sale you receive an extra 15% off on top of the 20% discount and the sale price. Bloomingdale's goes all out for this event, with great sale prices, raffles, giveaways. Last year they had a drawing for a BMW!

This is a community-wide fundraising effort and we can raise much needed funds for REGAP. You can help by selling tickets to your friends, family, co-workers, neighbors and they will benefit by having a day of shopping with a discount. The Rainbow Bridge

They all run and play together, but the day comes when one suddenly stops and looks into the distance. The bright eyes are intent, the eager body quivers. Suddenly, he begins to run from the group, flying over the green grass, his legs carrying him faster and faster. You have been spotted, and when you and your special friend finally meet, you cling together in joyous reunion, never to be parted again. HELP NEEDED ASAP:



Please help!!!! After two long years of being on a waiting list for an agility dog, we have been notified by the breeder that, at long last, our number has come up and ...WE ARE HAVING A PUPPY!!!

We must get rid of our children IMMEDIATELY because we just know how time consuming our new little puppy is going to be and it just wouldn't be fair to the children. Since our little puppy will be arriving on Monday we MUST place the children into rescue this weekend!

They are described as:

One male - His name is Tommy, Caucasian (English/Irish mix), light blonde hair, blue eyes. Four years old. Excellent disposition. He doesn't bite. Temperament tested. Does have problems with peeing directly in the toilet. Has had chickenpox and is current on all shots. Tonsils have already been removed. Tommy eats everything, is very clean, house trained & gets along well with others. Does not run with scissors and with a little training he should be able to read soon.

One female - Her name is Lexie, Caucasian (English/Irish mix), strawberry blonde hair, green eyes quite freckled. Two years old. Can be surly at times. Non-biter, thumb sucker. Has been temperament tested but needs a little attitude adjusting occasionally. She is current on all shots, tonsils out, and is very healthy & can be affectionate. Gets along well with other little girls & little boys but does not like to share her toys and therefore would do best in a one child household. She is a very quick learner and is currently working on her house training-shouldn't take long at all.

We really do LOVE our children so much and want to do what's right for them; that is why we contacted a rescue group. But we simply can no longer keep them. Also, we are afraid that they may hurt our new puppy. I hope you understand that ours is a UNIQUE situation and we have a real emergency here!!! They MUST be placed into your rescue by Sunday night at the latest or we will be forced to drop them off at the orphanage or along some dark, country road. Our priority now has to be our new puppy.

FLEA AND HEARTWORM SEASON

It's that time of year again. We suggest that you get a Heartworm test in April. Once you have received a negative test result, start giving the first pill no later than May 1st. Heartworm pills work 6 weeks backwards. We also start the flea preventative the same day. While you



are at your vet's office you need to make sure your dog's vaccinations are up-to-date. Your greyhound's vaccinations must be updated every year. This includes: Rabies, Distemper, <u>and</u> Bordatella vaccinations.

We recommend the following choices:

HEARTWORM PILLS - Interceptor or Heartguard.

<u>FRONTLINE</u> - Kills Fleas, Ticks, Eggs, Larvae, Adults (liquid that you put on nape of neck once a month).

DO NOT USE REVOLUTION on your hounds. It has killed Greyhounds. DO NOT GET THE SIX-MONTH SHOT EITHER.

Heartworm Pills / Flea protection is given once a month starting no later than May 1st through Dec. 1st or second killing frost. If you are not sure about anything, please give us a call or e-mail us at regap1@juno.com.

HEAT & HUMIDITY KILL

With summer comes heat and humidity. If you need to walk your dog when it's hot and humid; walk only in the early morning and late at night. If it's **really** hot and humid you may just want to take them out to do their business and get them right back into the air-conditioned house.



If you don't have air-conditioning in your car, leave the dog home! Cars get much hotter quicker than you might think. These dogs haven't any fat to cool themselves. Never leave your greyhound outside unattended, no matter what the weather. They can get into things they shouldn't and anything can happen.

We do have Cool Coats available through Donna Nowak. These are coats made out of towels that you dip in cold water and are able to walk your dog when it's a little hotter than we would like. They are <u>greyt</u>! We use them for any outdoor event that might get too hot.

MOSQUITO PROTECTION

Dogs aren't typically the recipients of the West Nile virus but if the mosquitoes are as bad this summer as they were last summer, you may want to help your hound keep those buggers off. You can spray them with Skintastic for kids or put a little Avon Skin So Soft on them. Anything else may be harmful to greyhounds. Advantix only works the first week or so, then fades leaving your hound vulnerable. We also have a greyt natural recipe on the message board of REGAP's website, the thread is called Natural Bug Repellent.

LEPTOSPIROSIS AND GIARDIA

Please make sure that your dog does not drink any water outside that might be contaminated. We have recently lost a greyhound to Leptospirosis. Leptospirosis is found in standing water. We have vaccinated for this but there might be a stronger form out there. Please make sure you always clean your bird baths frequently and fill with fresh water. Keep your hounds away from swimming pools and ponds. Dump any standing water after every rain, this also cuts down on mosquitoes.

We have seen an increase in greyhounds with giardia. They are infected if they come in contact with bird or animal feces or contaminated water. If your greyhound seems to always have loose stool, please ask your vet if you should have them treated for giardia.

We also have a copy of the flyer we used to find Octane when he was lost, you can copy it and put in a picture of your hound with all the necessary information and put that flyer EVERYWHERE!!

BE ALERT! 🤰

With Summer here you may want to carry pepper spray, an umbrella or a walking stick with you when you take your greyhound for a walk. Many of our adopters and their greyhounds have been attacked on walks in the past years. You all know that the beautiful greyhound usually won't protect themselves and their skin can tear so easily. <u>Be alert, don't take any chances!!!</u>
