How to get the adoption process going

So, it's time for a new dog in your life. A retired greyhound is a pet your family will cherish for many years. The process is easier than you may think. When people inquire about adopting this special breed, the same questions seem to pop up. Here's a few:

How much does it cost?

The adoption fee is \$275.00, which includes spay/neuter, rabies, DHPP & bordetella shots, dental, heartworm screen, worming, tick fever panel, microchip, temperament testing and grooming.

Is it a long process?

An application can be obtained on our website. Fill out our online application or print the application and mail it in. Pending approval, the adoption can be completed in just a matter of days.

Do greyhounds require special care?

All dogs need to be walked, and greyhounds are no exception. Since these dogs are retired racers, they should only be allowed to run free in a fenced area. They're not familiar with life off the track and may run into traffic. They will also need some initial assistance negotiating stairs—something they've never seen. All children living in your home must be at least five (5) years old.

Where are the dogs?

REGAP's greyhounds are kept at WilMoore Kennels in Mendota, Illinois. Potential adopters are encouraged to come out and meet the dogs.
